Texel Sheep Farm

Once we opened the doors to the barn at the far end, we entered into a world of free-roaming sheep, roosters, and chickens! Lambing season was in full swing. Many lambs still nestled in with their mothers on soft beds of hay. It was a memorable, fully immersive experience.





De Slufter

The stunning coastal landscape of De Slufter was next on our agenda. From the stairs at the top of windswept dunes, we descended to mudflats below. A spoonbill sifted through a shallow drainage stream for an early lunch. A soft breeze and the rays of the late spring sun enveloped us in a gentle embrace.

It was incredibly peaceful there. We practically had the trails to ourselves: the nearest people were far enough away to look like specks on the horizon. The landscape's pastel hues of blue sky, green beach grass, ecru dunes, and muddy earth blended into a feast for the eyes.
